YEAR 9 TRANSITION WORKSHOP WITH BARNARDOS

Our Year 9 pupils have been taking part in transition workshops which is delivered by Barnardo's.

The workshop encourages collaboration of viewpoints, ideas and strategies from young people, within a safe and confidential environment. Not only do we want our young people to foster the values and ethos within school. The sessions encourage young people to contribute positively to their wider community, by giving them the tools to do so.

The boys have engaged really well with the workshops and have enjoyed these sessions.







ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Every day in school counts...



Every day the children's attendance and punctuality is recorded on our school system by our administration team. The attendance team works closely with the Local Authority to monitor attendance and punctuality across the school. We look for things that we can put into place to improve attendance and lateness and to support families who need help with getting children into school on time every day.

We celebrate when children exceed our 97% target, as this means they are continuing to access learning where possible. We also celebrate those with the most improved attendance across all KS2 & KS3. Each week, the class with the highest attendance wins the Attendance Award which gives each pupil in that class 50 reward points. These then account towards their chosen reward, whether that is a sensory toy, sports equipment, a new book, a voucher or an educational visit.

We understand that sometimes children are sick, which results in them being unable to attend school. If you decide to keep your child at home due to their illness, it's important that you make contact with the school office by 9:00am to let us know why your child won't be in school. You will need to make sure you keep in contact with the school, on a daily basis with an update about your child's illness.

CLASS 9 (PARTHENON) UPDATE

The boys have been adventurous with the ingredients they have used and we are really proud of how safe they have been in the kitchen.










CLASS 2 (PYRAMIDS) UPDATE

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY AND SPEECH & LANGUAGE THERAPY TEAM FROM THE LINKS THERAPY COMPANY

At Lea Hall Academy we recognise the benefits of ensuring that the holistic needs of all children are met and, as such, we commission additional support from Links Therapy Company in the form of Occupational Therapy and Speech and Language Therapy. They may work with your child's class teacher to help them meet the sensory and communication needs of your child.

The company consists of experienced therapists many of whom have worked for several years within the school system and the NHS. All therapists have a special interest in working with children and young people.

The therapist may observe your child in school as a part of the development of universal, whole school provision. If your child has a specific need identified through their EHCP or identified through general classroom work, however, they may carry out some focussed work and assessments, in order to provide a programme for your child, which staff at school will then carry out on a regular basis. To support their work they may wish to seek information from other therapists who have worked with your child in the past. They may also send a questionnaire home to get a fuller picture of how your child is getting on and they may ask you to come into school to chat with them. In order to do specific work with your child Links Therapy will need your consent. You can give consent in advance by completing and returning the slip below or alternatively we can contact you for consent if we identify work that needs to be done with your child.

We are very pleased to be able to offer this service to our pupils and would welcome any questions or comments you may have. If you haven't already, please send back your child's consent form so we can offer this service to them.
